Under DHS policy, you have the right to be housed according to the gender you identify as. Shelter workers are required to call you by the name and pronouns you use and place you in a shelter that matches your gender, regardless of what your ID documents say.

- You cannot be forced to go to a facility that does not match your gender
- You cannot be forced to dress in a way that does not match your gender.
